I remember when my mom first told me I had lost an uncle to AIDS. It was this weird feeling of confusion and sorrow that I don't think I ever got over. Losing someone I didn't quite know, but felt like I had an intimate hand with

When I was first asked to direct *The Boy From Oz* for FRC, I didn't know who Peter Allen was, but when I listened to his music, I instantly recognized it and the intimate bond I had with the songs "When I Go To Rio" and "I Still Call Australia Home." His songs were campy, odd tunes that would sometimes play on my record player at home. But I never actually knew of the person who sang these songs.

This production is an attempt to tackle two mighty things. The first was to honour Peter's life. To honour his ideas, hopes, and dreams for those around him. We attempted to cast and create a production based on how we thought Peter viewed the world. It's a world that doesn't know gender, sexuality, or race. Albeit this is quite a privileged and wild world, it is from the perspective of someone who lived in a time that I am not too familiar with. But it is also a world filled with glitter, lights and pizazz (something I know VERY well!).

The second attempt with this show was to honour those we lost to AIDS. What the crisis of AIDS did to people and our modern culture is something I don't think we will ever fully grasp. What we lost has affected how the arts culture exists (with a massive lack of POC individuals in places of leadership, whereas if we hadn't lost the great amount of queer men of colour, I feel our modern arts culture would be very different). We wouldn't have lost the great artists like Peter, Freddie Mercury, Liberace, Anthony Perkins, or Rock Hudson. The list is endless.

But this play isn't completely about loss. It's a play about what we do with the things we lose, but also the things we gain from that loss. What we gain in dreams, in hopes, in goals. When I came out as queer, I had a great loss for a part of my life that I would never have back. But I gained a courage and fire to live my life more authentically and fully and to tell stories that mattered to me. To tell stories like that of Peter, and that of my uncle.

I want to thank everybody who joined us on the journey of making this incredible story come to life. Thank you to the cast, the crew, the production team, the directing team. With the tricky beast that is community theatre, it asks a LOT of those who agree to wrestle and play with it. What you will see today is a musical built out of literal sweat, literal blood, and literal tears. It was born out of frustrations, joy, anger, glee, and adrenaline. It was born out of a love of telling stories and singing songs. It was born from someone like you.

Thank you for supporting this musical. For buying a ticket and sitting down. I hope this musical uplifts you in ways you weren't expecting and draws you into the magical world that Peter Allen wanted us to live in.

A world where your baby smiles at you and you go to Rio!

Peter Allen was an Australian singer-songwriter, musician and entertainer, known for his flamboyant stage persona and lavish costumes. His songs were made popular by many recording artists, including Elkie Brooks, Melissa Manchester and Olivia Newton-John, with one, "Arthur's Theme (Best That You Can Do)" by Christopher Cross, winning an Academy Award for Best Original Song in 1981. In addition to recording many albums, he enjoyed a cabaret and concert career, including appearing at the Radio City Music Hall riding a camel.

PETER ALLEN, OUT LOUD

In high school, Peter Allen was my secret lover.

But not in the way you're probably thinking. These were the days of vinyl, back when it more functional than fashionable. In the privacy of my bedroom, I scoured album liner notes, searching for Peter's name among the songwriting credits of my gay divas: Olivia Newton-John, Helen Reddy, Melissa Manchester, Anne Murray and Maureen McGovern, to name a few.

Until he broke through as a solo performer, I fancied Peter Allen as my own personal discovery. Well before the sequins and theatricality of I Go to Rio, or the wink-and-a-nod in-joke of Bi-Coastal, Peter's decidedly queer sensibility stood out to me. And I loved him for that. It wasn't camp that gave him away though. It was his deep understanding of vulnerability and irony - precisely the weapons we little gay boys needed to survive in the seventies.

"Don't cry out loud Just keep it inside And learn how to hide your feelings"

It was probably no coincidence so many of Allen's greatest songs were written with women like Reddy and Carole Bayer Sager, and so many recorded by female singers. He understood the politics of empowerment, and the loneliness that accompanied being an outsider. **Tenterfield Saddler** can break your heart when you understand Peter's roots in rural Oz, and the virulent homophobia that greeted him from the Australian media. The gay closet enters into his biggest songwriting hit, **I Honestly Love You**, in a way few of us understood in the time:

If we both were born
In another place and time
This moment might be ending in a kiss

But there you are with yours And here I am with mine So I guess we'll just be leaving it at this

The closet led Allen to write coded lyrics about being trapped – with melancholy and sadness, even resignation - but never with self-pity.

I could have been a sailor I made my choice in life I chose to settle down I chose to take a wife

I could have been a lover
Watchin' waves before me part
But I settled for safer harbors of my heart.

Peter Allen's voyage came to an end far too early in 1992 as a result of AIDS-related cancer. But in that all too-brief life, he wrote and sang with sensitivity, honesty and wit. If only one of his songs could serve as an epitaph, I'd pick an obscure and somewhat prophetic 1975 track, **Long Time Looking**:

I guess I'll be a long time looking Looking for that long time one 'Cause when you've had the very best All there is, is all the rest
So I'll keep right on looking
'Cause you've been a long time gone

MY LIFE WITH HIU

It was 32 years ago when I acquired HIV, and it was 32 years ago in October that I received my HIV diagnosis. There were no treatment options, I was told get my affairs in order and that I would likely be gone in the next 3-5 years. I went home, told a couple of friends and kept it secret from family and friends as shame and guilt prevented sharing my diagnosis at the time.

It was a time of loss, grief and despair, all while putting on a brave front and going about my days as if nothing was wrong. I would just wait and deal with things when they happened. Medications to treat HIV began to emerge, some with harsh side effects and some with minor improvement in delaying the process of HIV replication.

Mid 90's I began to show the early signs of HIV treatment failure and an AIDS diagnosis soon followed. I took a number of medications upwards of 40 pills per days for treatment of HIV and prevention of opportunistic infections. I had to start making serious and emotionally draining decisions for my future.

I told my family and friends as I could no longer hide the illness and impact it had as I fell ill and onto disability no longer able to work. Depression, addiction and isolation were more the norm as I watched my relationship with my partner slip away though all the challenges the illness was having on us. I started making my final arrangements, saying good bye to people and preparing for the worst.

In 1996, weighing 95 lbs and barely able to climb the stairs, I received a call from the Southern Alberta Clinic about a new clinical trial using "protease inhibitors". They felt I was a good candidate so I took the tests and began treatment. This added another 18 pills to my day, but my options were this or nothing.

In 45 days, my weight increased to 175 lbs, I was able to do many things that just weeks before I could not, like walking my dog and shoveling the walk and driveway. You never know the joy of shoveling snow until you no longer can; like many things in life. I kept getting better.

This all lead to my returning to work and community as I felt a need to give back. I got involved with AIDS Calgary (now HIV Community Link) as a volunteer; however, I did not disclose my HIV status or register as a client.

This connection to the agency and people living with HIV was the catalyst for the new life — one of self-discovery, new learnings & direction with a move into activism & advocacy for people with HIV. This led to more work over the years in the field of HIV education and prevention sharing the advances and facts about HIV with others. Many things have changed and great advancements in treatment and prevention have resulted.

In all this amazing stride forward to address HIV, there remains funding & resources challenges for doing the work and one overarching challenge of HIV STIGMA.

In my 30 years of living with HIV I have witnessed it all; from we have no treatment so make your final arrangements, to HIV treatment works and can prevent the transmission of HIV to sexual partners while living a full and productive life.

<u>I could never have imagined that 32 years later I would still be here and able to share this message of Undetectable = Untransmittable.</u>
