

The Music Man Opens on Broadway

The Official Opening night came December 19, 1957 at the Majestic Theatre in New York. Few in the show business community expected it to be successful. Everyone said it was "too corny", "too wordy", or cursed by "too much counterpoint". No one was prepared for the overjoyed audience response that shook the Majestic that night. As the reviewer from Variety described it, "Something happened in that theatre on opening night which was without precedent. In the touching finale, the audience broke out spontaneously into applause to the even rhythm of the music. Nothing like it has ever been seen on Broadway".



MUSICAL SYNOPSIS
