DIRECTOR'S NOTE

n 1930, Christopher Isherwood began a prolonged stay in the German capital city of Berlin, during which time he made the acquaintance of several individuals who would form the basis of his "Berlin Stories", which in turn went through various metamorphoses to eventually emerge as the musical *Cabaret*.

Just as Isherwood's stories have experienced many changes, so too has the musical itself, in various different rewritten incarnations between 1966 and the present day. What hasn't changed is the power of the story and its basic thematic material.

In this production I have allowed myself to be informed by the original Isherwood stories. Where interpretation was needed, I looked to the original 1937 story *Sally Bowles* as a starting off point in developing my vision for the show.

For me, the hallmark of a successful dramatic production is in seeing a cast and production team take my original vision for the show and work with me to create something far greater than originally conceived. Theatre is the ultimate cooperative venture, with so many disparate elements striving towards a cohesive whole. The professionalism I have witnessed from the enormously talented team of creative people that is FRC Hot!'s Cabaret has produced the show you see here on the Victor Mitchell Stage.

And now... so many people to thank, so little room. I'd like to particularly mention Becky and Pasqualina who, in their rather unique capacities as co-Stage Managers and co-Producers, helped turn my sometimes pipe-dream and envelope-pushing concepts into reality and who helped keep me grounded as the yangs to my yin.

Scott has done tremendous work in adapting the music of *Cabaret* into a form workable for a production of our size and with the constraints under which we work as community theatre. Karen's wonderful, fun and sly choreography has helped bring the Kit Kat Klub to life. Frank, Jane and Paul have brilliantly provided the show's eye candy.

And I can't say enough about the wonderful cast that I've been fortunate enough to work with on this show. Sex and chocolate, everyone!!

The thematic material of *Cabaret* is far-reaching, and the audience as well are to be thanked for their indulgence: if there is one question I hope to begin addressing with this production, it is: "How could the Holocaust have been allowed to happen?" By putting the audience in the role of the average German citizen in pre-World War II Germany, hopefully this question can be partially answered.

It's been an incredible, exciting, thought-provoking excursion to 1930s Berlin. But for now, auf wiedersehen... à bientôt...

Adolf Hitler joins the "German Workers Party". Whereas in the summer of 1921 \$1.00 US was worth 4.20 marks, by November, 1923, the exchange rate stood at 4,200,000,000 marks. 1923 -After his failed "Beer Hall Putsch" revolution, Hitler is imprisoned. 1924 During this time he writes his propaganda-filled, antisemitic call to arms, Mein Kampf, published in 1925. 1929 Christopher Isherwood visits Berlin for the first time 1930 -Isherwood begins an extended stay in Berlin, during which time he 1933 will keep diaries that will become the basis for his two best-known works, Mr. Norris Changes Trains and Goodbye to Berlin. 1933 Hitler comes to power in Germany, as Chancellor of the German Reich. 1937 Sally Bowles, based on Isherwood's friend Jean Ross, is published in a small press edition. 1938 Anti-semitism in Germany reaches a boiling point, with "Kristallnacht", during which most synagogues are destroyed and many Jews murdered. Antisemitism will continue to grow under Hitler, until by the end of World War II, an estimated 6,000,000 Jews (along with enormous numbers of gypsies, homosexuals, trade unionists and others) will have been exterminated. 1939 Isherwood's Goodbye to Berlin, which includes the short novel Sally Bowles, is published, introducing the world at large to the characters upon whom Cabaret is based. 1939 -World War II is waged. 1945 1951 I am a Camera, a play written by John Van Druten and based primarily on Goodbye to Berlin is produced on Broadway.

WHO WAS WHO IN CABARET?



The source material for "Sally Bowles" was provided by Jean Ross, an Englishwoman who lived for a time in the same boarding house (run by Meta Thurau -- see below) as Christopher Isherwood. Her carefree ways inspired the best-loved of all Isherwood's various characters, although he admits that, after being immortalized in print and portrayed on stage and screen by such actresses as Julie Harris, Jill Haworth and Liza Minelli, he could not recall much of how he met Jean Ross. By the time he wrote candidly and truthfully of his Berlin experiences in his 1975 autobiography Christopher and His

Kind, his memories of the fictional "Sally" had overpowered those of Jean.

Isherwood remained friends with Jean Ross until her death in 1973. She was survived by her daughter, noted pipe-smoking mystery writer Sarah Cauldwell.

"Sally"'s last name was borrowed from Isherwood's friend, the musician and novelist Paul Bowles.

It is upon Christopher William Bradshaw Isherwood's autobiographical works that Cabaret is based, and he himself was the model for "Clifford Bradshaw". The character actually appeared with the "Isherwood" name in Goodbye to Berlin and the play I am a Camera, but the name was changed to "Bradshaw"

for *Cabaret*, some say because Isherwood himself wanted to distinguish the very heterosexual "Cliff" character of the 1966 production from his own, openly gay self.

Christopher Isherwood was a noted writer, whose close friends included other notables such as W. H. Auden and E. M. Forster. In the early 1950s, Isherwood was involved in the pioneering gay rights organization, One, Inc. He met his lifelong partner, acclaimed artist Don Bachardy (then 18 years old; 29 years his junior!), in 1953.

Christopher Isherwood died in 1986.

(See the timeline on the opposite page for more information.)

Various other characters in Cabaret have been inspired by real people. Isherwood's Berlin landlady when he lived on the Nolledorfplatz was Meta Thurau, who became "Fräulein Schroeder" in Goodbye to Berlin, and "Fräulein Schneider" in I am a Camera and Cabaret. Isherwood remained in touch with her after World War II, right into the 1950s.

"Bobby" was named for a bartender who also lived in Meta
Thurau's boarding house, and the personality of "Victor" was
partially based on "Otto Nowak" (pictured above right; Isherwood never revealed his real name), with whom Isherwood had an affair during his stay in Germany. (According to Christopher and His Kind, it was actually Otto who shared
his room while he lived on the Nollendorfplatz, not "Sally"!)
