

Director's Notes



You may ask yourself, "Why would this guy pick *The Producers* to make his directorial debut?" Well I thought I would start with an easy one.

Yeah, right.

But what it comes down to, for me, is the story that lies at the heart of the piece. When Mel Brooks first conceived the original movie, it was a biting and dark satire meant to lampoon the Nazi regime. Panned by critics and theatre goers when it was released in '68, it was considered too offensive and shocking. It has since been listed by the AFI

as one of the top 20 comedies of all time (including 2 of Mel Brooks's other masterpieces: *Blazing Saddles* and *Young Frankenstein*). When remaking *The Producers* into a Broadway musical, the tone was lightened and at its heart is a story about two people who discover that it's friendship that they have been searching for their entire lives and with that they can accomplish anything... while still making fun of Hitler. 'Cause really, how can you not? The guy was just so lovable.

I couldn't have done a show of this magnitude without all the support and sheer brilliance that everyone has brought to the table. From Angela's dynamic and ingenious choreography, that expresses the mood and energy of each piece succinctly and vividly, yet is constantly surprising. To Wilma's deftness and adeptness with the score that goes through several key changes and tempo changes all within one song, but makes it sound like it's completely natural and second nature. James' fantastic set design, Paul's lustrous lighting, Diana and Melissa's gorgeous costumes, Mavis and Julie's adroitness with finding and creating props, Jeremy's subtle and balanced sound design, Cat's beautiful hair & makeup, the fabulous cast who were beaten down every day in rehearsal and kept coming back for more, the thankless job of our backstage crew, our tireless volunteers helping out with Front of House, the list goes on and on. Of course I would be remiss if I did not include my wonderful Stage Manager and ASM: Leah and Meredith; without whom I would have run naked down the street screaming incoherently. Thank you for keeping me sane.

And I cannot forget my own Max & Leo, Darren and Megan. You two have put in a tremendous amount of work and should have taken a few lessons from the show and figured out a way to steal as much money as you could. Because no one can ever pay you what you deserve. Janos Zeller - Director
