
The Strange Case of Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde, by Robert Louis Stevenson, was published in January of 1886. It is the first introduction to the characters of Dr. Henry Jekyll and Mr. Edward Hyde. The well-constructed novella focuses on the discrepancies between outward appearance and true identity. Mr. Hyde is more of a lecherous carouser than a monstrous murderer and "gave an impression of deformity without a namable malformation"

So where did the modern idea of Hyde being a monster come from? Interestingly, Richard Mansfield's portrayal of Mr. Hyde in the 1888 stage version coincided with the infamous Jack the Ripper murders. In fact, in the early days, the press nicknamed Jack the Ripper, Mr. Hyde, creating an inseparable link between the fictional character and the notorious London serial killer.

And so Wildhorn and Bricusse's modern musical is a haunting marriage of the themes of societal pressures from Stevenson's original novella and the horror that is evoked when thinking of Jack the Ripper.

I would like to thank an amazing cast for all their hard work and dedication to this project. They bring this piece to life in a way no one else could. And thank you to our amazing design/production team. Without them there would be no magic to our show (and I would be bald from pulling my hair out!) Please sit back, enjoy *Jekyll and Hyde*, the gothic musical, based on Mr. Stevenson's take on societal pressures in a modern city.


TRACY SMITH (NELLIE)
