

As an awkward 17 year old, my first connection to *Dogfight* came in the form of the 1991 Bob Comfort written and Nancy Savoca directed film starring Lili Taylor and River Phoenix. The film left an indelible mark. Partly because it was one of River Phoenix's last performances before his untimely death in 1993, but more poignantly, as an impressionable teenager, I appreciated the story it told about forgiveness, compassion and the strength of self. This was largely in part due to my own struggles with body image and how I fit within a society that places unrealistic importance on physical beauty and less on integrity and depth of character.

Fast forward several decades, I stumbled upon the musical by happenstance. I was delighted (and surprised) since the film, while dear to me, wasn't exactly a blockbuster. Once the hauntingly beautiful music by Broadway darlings Benj Pasek & Justin Paul hit my ear drums, I was done. I knew it was a musical that I needed to see and experience. And here we are.

Dogfight highlights the banal themes of sexism and misogyny (which is particularly timely and poignant in the era of Harvey Weinstein, #MeToo and the Times Up movement). Having said that, its goal isn't to vilify the Marines for their thoughtless and cruel dogfight contest, which was a historically accurate tradition in the Corps that allowed young Marines to untangle themselves from humanity so they could trudge into active combat where they would be expected to kill without guilt or culpability.

In their hearts, these young men aren't evil. They are products of strong gender and societal based indoctrination that has taught them that these behaviours are acceptable and encouraged - even when they aren't. It would be easy to say that they were a product of their time, sadly, behaviours such as theirs are still very much commonplace.

Although it would be easy to focus on the despicable nature of the inciting incident of the contest, **Dogfight**, through the Rose's strength of character and Eddie's journey, seeks to show that different choices can be made – the choice of empathy, compassion and forgiveness over misogyny and violence. It opens the dialogue that, while grievous behaviours such as this exist, there is another way. There is a path to understanding, redemption and the capacity to grow and change. It is definitely a sentiment that our modern society could use more of.

On a personal note, as a first time director, I have been gifted with an **extraordinarily** talented and supportive team of humans that makeup my fantastic cast, band, crew and production team. There will never be another experience like Dogfight for me. It has been truly special and will always be dear to my heart. My well of gratitude is overflowing for each and every person who helped make this production (and my first directing experience) a reality.



Born in Philadelphia, Pasek's mother was a professor and development psychologist who wrote and performed songs with a child's point of view. Her son started joining her in performances around the age of seven. Pasek went on to earn a BFA in musical theatre from the University of Michigan, where he met fellow theatre student Justin Paul at freshman orientation. They discovered a shared enthusiasm and quickly began collaborating. Their Broadway debut was A Christmas Story and in addition to Dogfight and James and the Giant Peach, they also wrote the Tony award winning musical Dear Evan Hansen.
